Friday 03 May	Calgary to Dublin	Departure for Dublin from Calgary
Saturday 04 May	Dublin	Arrive in Dublin and check into Hotel. Visit to Garden of Remembrance; Parnell Statue
Sunday 05 May	Dublin	Visit to Glasnevin Cemetery for tour and individual exploration and Pearse oration re-enactment
Monday 06 May	Dublin	Visit to Arbour Hill Memorial Croppy's Acre, Collin's Barracks and National Museum
Tuesday 07 May	Dublin	Travel from Dublin to the Battle of the Boyne Centre and Hill of Tara
Wednesday 8 May	Dublin	Visit Kilmainham Gaol and St. Stephen's Green; National Museum – Archaeology (optional)
Thursday 9 May	Dublin to Cork	Travel from Dublin to Cork, check into new accommodations. Visits enroute: Glendalough Visitors Centre/Monastic Site and Rock of Cashel
Friday 10 May	Cork	Visit to Cobh and Spike Island Tour; island beachcombing before ferry leaves
Saturday 11 May	Cork	Travel from hotel to various points in more rural areas near Cork as part of a War of Independence Tour
Sunday 12 May	Cork	Assignment Preparation Day and Instructor Office Hours
Monday 13 May	Cork to Roscommon	Travel from Cork to Roscommon and check into new accommodations. Visit Blarney Castle, Adare and Bunratty.
Tuesday 14 May	Roscommon	Tour the Strokestown House and the Famine Museum, as well as Roscommon's Norman Castle and Roscommon Workhouse.
Wednesday 15 May	Roscommon	Guided tour at Rathcroghan Visitors Centre, followed by driving tour
Thursday 16 May	Roscommon to Derry	Travel by coach from Roscommon to Derry (across border) and check into new accommodations. Visit IRA Memorial N61 at R36, Countess Markievicz Statue, Drumcliffe/Yeats Grave, and Mullaghmore.
Friday 17 May	Derry	Visit to the Museum of Free Derry, tour of Bogside Murals, walk along the walls, and Apprentice Boys' Memorial Hall.

Saturday 18 May	Derry	Go to Mass at St. Eunan's Cathedral in Letterkenny followed by Donegal County Museum
Sunday 19 May	Derry to Belfast	Travel from Derry to Belfast to new accommodations. Visits to Giant's Causeway, Carrickfergus Castle, and Crumlin Road Gaol.
Monday 20 May	Belfast	Assignment Preparation Day and Instructor Office Hours
Tuesday 21 May	Belfast area day trip	Day trip to Portadown Town, Milford House near Armagh, St. Patrick's Church in Armagh
Wednesday 22 May	Belfast	Visit to the Ulster Museum and Black Taxi Tour of civil war sites. Queen's University Quarter walking tour
