Degree Structure



How do I know which courses to take to explore my options?

- <u>What-If Advisement Report</u>
- Located in Student Centre Program & Advising Info tab
- Provides list of requirements met and to be completed
- Provides lists of courses available to satisfy requirements
- Use prior to course registration and to understand desired program before submitting COP application



Topic Four: Understanding COP Process





What is a Change of Program?

- Webform in Student Centre Program & Advising Info tab
- Free application available once per year
- Allows for one program choice
- Use to make *any* change to current program
 - Declare major/program

>Add combined degree, minor, embedded certificate

COP Admission



What do I need to be admitted?

- All majors/programs have admission requirements
- High school courses, uni-level prerequisites, uni GPA
- Evaluation based on Fall semester and prior only
- GPA = min 12units/4 courses to max 30units/10 courses
- Speak to a Program/Academic Advisor in desired faculty
