


Calgary: Census 2016

The lowest average age of major Canadian cities at 37.4. The median age of Calgarians is 36.4

73% households in Calgary own their homes

The **highest home ownership rate of major Canadian cities** and the fastest growing between 2011 and 2016

Specifically: **21.8%** own **condominiums**
58.3% own **single-family homes**

Commute Times

Calgary morning rush hour runs from 6:30 to 9:30 a.m.
29.3% of Calgarians leave for work between 7:00 and 8:00 a.m.

26.5 minutes Calgarians average commute time to work. The Canadian average commute time is 26.2 minutes

41.6 minutes Calgary average commute time using public transit

18.2 minutes Calgary average commute time by walking or cycling

Place of Work

 **7.1%**

of Calgarians worked from home. Of those working from home, 47% are male and 53% are female

Language at Work

97.4% of the working population use English at work


0.2% use French at work

1.1% use non-official languages including Cantonese, Punjabi, Spanish, Tagalog (Filipino) and Mandarin



Education

Calgary had the **third highest post-secondary educational attainment** of major Canadian cities (25 to 64 years old)



In addition:

45.2% of **immigrants** have a bachelor's degree or higher

17.5% of **Aboriginals** have a bachelor's degree or higher

Calgary had the **highest proportion of STEM graduates** of major Canadian cities

17.7% of **graduates** have **degrees in STEM**
